Unions, like the UFCW, require employees to pay dues as a condition of membership. That's money that comes out of your pocket and goes into theirs. **That money does not come back to Mud Bay.**

The UFCW's national organization and the Local **UFCW 3000** may spend money on things you might not expect...

The UFCW National collected **\$215 million dollars in dues** during 2024–2025, **yet they spent less than a third of that representing members.**¹

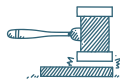
The other two-thirds of membership dues were spent on things like:

The UFCW 3000 also spent \$400,000 last year on hotels and transportation, amusement park outings, and Uber Eats.²
